Corpus Christi has an **Attendance Policy** which can be accessed on the school website [here](#).

It is the school's expectation that all pupils attend school every day, unless they are ill, for the following reasons:

- attendance has a direct link to attainment. If a child is not in school regularly they are not fully accessing the curriculum and learning opportunities available to them
- achieving at school builds a child's self-esteem, as well as enhancing their future prospects
- attending school and being part of the school's community gives a child a sense of belonging and promotes their social development
- attending school gives a child the opportunity to experience positive separation from their parent(s)/carer(s), which builds their confidence and resistance.

The law states that it is the responsibility of parents to ensure that compulsory school aged children (5 to 16 years) access an appropriate educational provision.

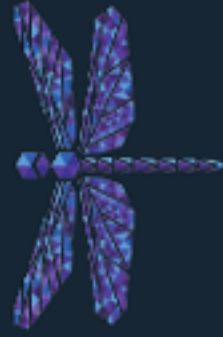

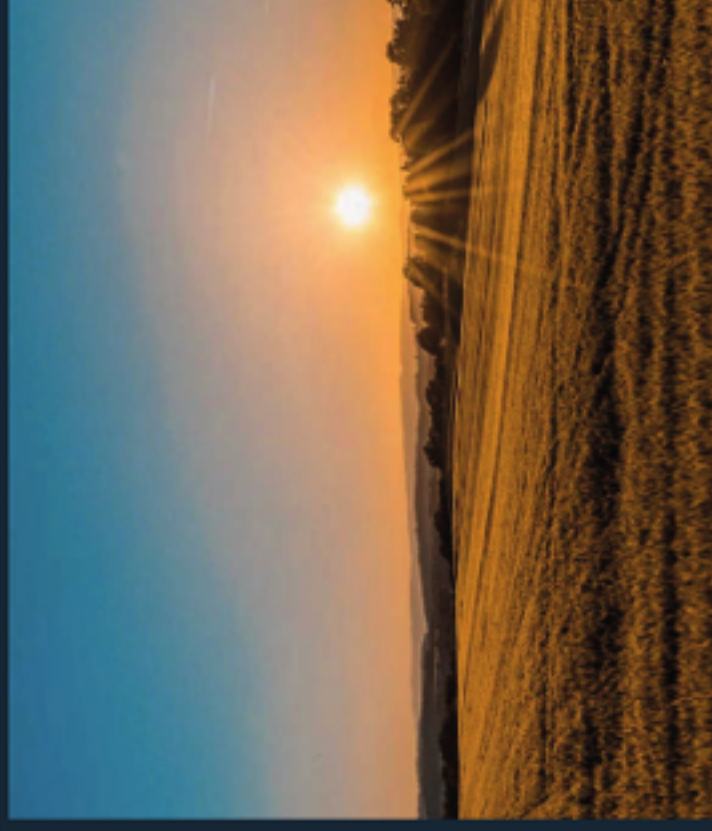

Early help navigators

For 0 to 19 years or
up to 25 with SEND

Who are early help navigators?



Our team of friendly early help navigators can support you and your family when you need it most. They work with many organisations, schools and services to offer information, guidance and support.

All families face challenges at some stage and early help is about providing support as soon as issues arise, to help prevent them escalating.

Our approachable team of early help navigators will listen to you and your areas of concern. They will work with you to find out what's working well and what further help you need.

What support can they offer?

The support you are offered will depend on your family's individual needs and may include some of the following:

Connecting to additional services

Early help navigators can discuss your family's needs and connect you to specific services, relevant to your personal situation. They work with other organisations to find the best suitable early help support.



Services offered by early help navigators

For under fives:

You will be offered a warm welcome to the many groups for 0 to 5's that are available in our family hubs, or at community venues across Bournemouth, Christchurch and Poole.

Help and support with your parenting journey:

Your early help navigator may talk to you about our parenting programmes offer and decide, with you, which may be the most suitable. If appropriate, these may be held in your child's school, or at your local family hub.

Family hubs and school drop ins:

Early help navigators offer regular drop ins at family hubs and schools across Bournemouth, Christchurch and Poole. Please pop in to speak to one of our friendly team, they would be delighted to see you.

Our team are here for you and your family, to help you access the support you need and connect you to appropriate services, to make your family life better. For the latest groups and activities running at your local family hub visit our timetables section on our website.

Background

The BCP Child Safeguarding Practice Review Group completed two Rapid Reviews following incidents of young children falling out of windows at their home address. In September 2023, a task and finish group reviewed the safety arrangements in houses, particularly around window safety.

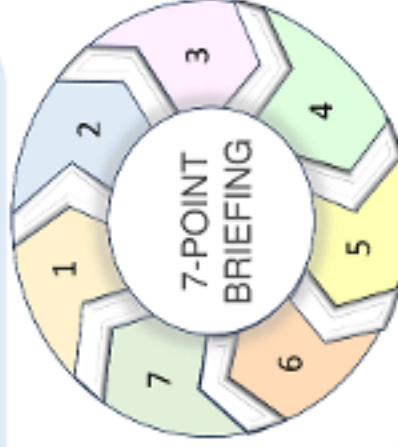

Why it matters

According to the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents (ROSPA), more than 4,000 children under the age of 15 years are injured falling from windows each year in the UK. One child under 5 years is admitted to hospital every day after falling from a building and in need of specialist hospital treatment for significant head injuries.

A study on injuries to children caused by unintentional falls from windows, showed a high proportion of falls were not witnessed by another individual suggesting children were being left unattended before their fall.

The number of falls from windows involving vulnerable adults is also on the rise according to Health and Safety Executive (HSE).

Repairs info:

- Repairs to windows can be reported online through the [repair's portal](#), or by calling 0800 028 1870.
- Self-referrals can be accepted for minor adaptations, these include grab rails, window restrictors, bolt locks and lever taps. A disability need for these adaptations will have to be demonstrated and confirmation from adult or children social care may be requested.
- Bespoke stairgates can be referred by a [Child Health and Disability Occupational Therapist](#).
- Housing Officers will complete window safety checks during home visits and discuss window safety with new residents at sign-up appointments.

Window Safety

- Consider the ease of opening a window, the distance it can be opened, the design of the opening and height of the sill.
- Safety catches will reduce the likelihood of children being able to open a window unsupervised. These should be fitted to windows above ground floor level to reduce the possibility of an accident involving a child.
- If you're concerned about a window above ground floor that opens greater than 100mm without a restrictor or if there is a low sill height, this should be discussed with the landlord in the first instance. If further advice is required, you can contact Private Sector Housing: [privatesector.housing@bcpcouncil.gov.uk](#).

Advice for parents and carers:

- Keep keys to window locks where you can easily find them, in case you need to escape from a fire.
- Keep furniture away from windows to prevent children from climbing and reaching windows.
- Make sure there's nothing else near a window (like a toy box) that young children can use as a step.

Action with BCP Homes

- When a property has been vacated BCP will check whether there are window restrictors and will be added where required.
- Guidance will be produced for residents of new BCP Homes, in the interim, Housing Officers will offer window safety advice at sign-up and during home visits.
- Housing Officers will complete a window safety check during home visits.
- Information on window safety has been shared with families and practitioners using newsletters and social media.
