ASYLUM SPEAKERS

As a School of Sanctuary, we are committed to promoting a culture of welcome and inclusion across our school community. This week, we welcomed a special guest speaker from a refugee charity 'Asylum Speakers' to share their experience as a refugee with children in Years 4-6.

Asylum Speakers charity gives refugees a voice. Giel, came to visit our school and gave a talk to our year 4-6 children on his first hand experience as a child refugee. He is now living, working and studying law in the UK.

The children were captivated by his journey. Giel really engaged the children, not only with his personal story, but with movement and songs. The children experienced his journey with all their senses, and were truly shocked by what he had to endure at such a young age.

Giel was able to answer their many questions with his natural joy and humility, and his story has been a reminder to all of us that we are all responsible for each other; what we do affects others, what others experience affects us.











ONLINE SAFETY

How you can use Play Like Share to help keep your child safe online

You can watch *Play Like Share* with your child and use this to start a conversation with them about the internet and being safer online. All three episodes can be found here:

https://www.ceopeducation.co.uk/parents/playlikeshare/ You will also find a fun interactive game called *Band Runner* for 8-10 year olds that helps this age group learn how to be safer from risks they might encounter online.

When opening the conversation with your child, start with positives, finding out as much as you can about what your child does online and what it means to them.

Things you could try:

- Ask your child to show you their favourite websites, apps or social media and what they do on them. Listen and show interest. You could also encourage them to teach you the basics of the site or app.
- Ask your child if anything ever bothers or worries them about going online. You could use examples of events from the films and ask if they've ever heard of something similar happening.
 Talk in general about what children can do to stay safe online.
- Use examples from *Play Like Share* to start a conversation about online 'friends' or 'followers'. Ask them about who they chat to online, and whether they know and trust them 'in real life'.
- Talk about the importance of privacy settings and how they can help your child stay in control of what they share with others. Together, look at the privacy settings for the services they use, encourage them to only share things with people they know and trust in person.
- Using examples from *Play Like Share*, talk to your child about what might be appropriate or inappropriate to share online this includes photos, videos, comments and personal information.
- Talk to your child about how their online actions can affect others. Remind them to consider how someone else might feel before they post or share something.
- Ensure your child understands that if anything ever happens online which worries or upsets them, they should always tell you.
- Explain that you would never blame them for anything that might happen online, and you will always give them calm and non-judgemental support.
- Make online safety an on-going conversation in your house... and involve the rest of the family in the conversation too.








Online relationship support for parents

Arguing better

Disagreements are a normal part of life. How you approach them can make all the difference to you, your partner, and your children. You will learn:

- How to recognise stress and how it can affect you.
- How to support each other through difficult times.
- What causes arguments and how to stop them.



Me, You and Baby Too

Learn how to navigate the changes that happen in a relationship when a baby arrives, including:

- How you and your partner can support each other.
- How to talk to bring up difficult topics.
- How arguments start, and how to stop them.



Getting it right for children

When parents are separating or separated, children can often get caught in the middle. Learn how to communicate better to minimise the impact this can have on your children, as well as:

Support for Inter-Parental Communication

FREE support available for one or both parents

- Do you have a child or children aged between 8 and 14?
- Do you find it hard to get on with your partner or your ex?
- Do you argue or shout at each other?
- · Or have you stopped talking to each other because it's too difficult?

If so, then the SIPCo project could help.

Whether you are with your partner or have separated, are an LGBTQ+ parent, a parent in an extended family, or any other group, we are looking for parents and carers who live in Dorset, BCP (Bournemouth, Christchurch and Poole) and Bristol who:

- · have a child aged 8-14
- · are getting into conflict with a partner or ex-partner
- · are willing to try something new to help reduce their conflict.

You will be allocated either relationship therapy (delivered by the couple therapy charity Tavistock Relationships) or online support. A local practitioner will help you access the online support resources, which can be used at your own pace.

The project is trying to compare the two types of support, so parents will be provided with one or the other. We expect both kinds of support to be helpful for families.

In the relationship therapy sessions (which will take place online), a therapist will help you and your partner/ex to communicate better, while the online resources are programmes that you will work through at your own pace with the support of a locally trained professional.

PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR TERM-TIME HOLIDAYS ARE CHANGING

First Offence

The first time a
Penalty Notice is
issued for an
unauthorised term
time holiday the
fine amount will be:

£80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Increasing to £160 if paid between days 22-28.

Second Offence (within 3 years)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child, payable within 28 days.

Third Offence and any further offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and local authorities will need to consider other available measures to address the absence concerns. This may mean that cases are presented before a Magistrates' Court. If convicted, sanctions can include a fine of up to £2,500 and a prison sentence of up to 3 months, and you will have a criminal record.

Cases found guilty in the Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'.

Changes will come into force for Penalty Notice fines issued after 19th August 2024

Who may be fined?

Penalty Notice fines are issued to each parent who allows their child to be absent from school.

National Threshold:

All schools in England must consider a Penalty Notice when a pupil has 10 unauthorised absences in a 10 school-week rolling period. For example, a 5-day holiday would meet this threshold.
