Corpus Christi Catholic Primary School is voluntary-aided, providing a Christian education for children aged 4-11.

We are a school of over 400 children, taught in 14 classes. Our Reception and Year 1 classes are in our Early Years Annexe, situated between Corpus Christi Church and the Parish Centre in St. James's Square.

Our Catholic Faith

We recognise RE as our core subject and we adhere to a diocesan-wide curriculum, 'God Matters', which enables the children to deepen their understanding of the Catholic faith.

We recognise that parents are the primary educators of the faith and we work closely with the local parish and community to nurture our children in their faith journey.

We foster an ethos of serving both individuals and society through fundraising, supporting local and worldwide charities, and caring for our planet.

Children and staff have the opportunity to participate in daily collective worship, as a class or as a whole school. We are incredibly fortunate to have the Parish of Corpus Christi next door and we come together for Mass every Wednesday. Once every half term, we join the parish for Sunday Mass, leading the readings and music.

Our School Gospel Virtues

Our school community worked together to identify the virtues that should be our focus, both in our learning, and in our interactions with one another and the wider community.

We explicitly teach character education through these agreed Gospel Virtues and our Catholic approach to the curriculum.

The Eucharist

The name of our school, Corpus Christi, means 'The BODY OF CHRIST'. Throughout our curriculum, we seek to develop children's understanding that the Eucharist helps us to know who we are, and shows us what to do, so that we can become Eucharistically Christ-centred.







Curriculum

At Corpus Christi, we are very proud of the curriculum we provide for our children, and of their high academic achievements. Our curriculum recognises and develops the uniqueness of each child through broad and balanced learning experiences that are both enriching and challenging. We aim to educate and inform children so that they can take their place in society with an attitude of service and commitment to the common good.

Our Curriculum promotes long-term learning that ensures our children have access to 'the best that has been thought and said'. Equality, diversity and inclusion are embedded throughout the curriculum which reflect and celebrate global influences. Children are also taught to recognise and challenge prejudice and discriminatory behaviours.

As the children build their knowledge, they are challenged to apply what they know in increasingly complex ways. Each term, we work towards answering a curriculum enquiry question. Through a process of seejudge-act, this question links all of the learning and asks the children to make a judgement about the meaning of what they learn (or see), and act and respond in light of this.



English

When our children leave Corpus Christi, they are familiar with a range of genres and able to perform to and write for a variety of audiences and purposes that go beyond the school community. This begins in Early Years through our Sounds-Write phonics programme which teaches the necessary skills to be competent readers and writers. Corpus Christi is also a 'Talk 4 Writing' school where children use pictures and actions to learn a model text, immersing themselves in the text features. This provides children with a rich and varied language bank which in turn supports the writing process.

Maths

We believe that all children can succeed in Maths. By building confidence, resilience and a passion for Maths, we show that maths is an exciting adventure that everyone can enjoy, value and master. Children learn Maths through a Concrete, Pictorial, Abstract (CPA) approach- a highly effective approach to teaching, that develops a deep and sustainable understanding of Maths in children.

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The Arts and Culture

Passionate about the arts, Corpus Christi has registered for the Artsmark Award. We have specialist teachers for Music, Art, Multimedia and Spanish, ensuring teaching includes expert subject knowledge. We want every child to experience the very highest quality cultural education and develop their creativity. We have a specific Arts Council who meets regularly to discuss ways in which we can further improve our arts and culture provisions.

Art

We offer a culturally rich art curriculum, representing artists, craft makers and designers from around the globe. Children are taught how art and design both reflect and shape our history, and contribute to the culture, creativity and diversity of our world.

Our children have the opportunity to develop their skills in drawing, painting, sculpture and other art, craft and design techniques. Our art curriculum includes visiting galleries, contributing to school and community arts festivals, and children also have their own work exhibited in our virtual art gallery on the school's website.



Music

All children have the opportunity to learn and perform a musical instrument, sing and compose. Children perform, listen to, review and evaluate music across a range of historical periods, genres, styles and traditions, including the works of the great composers and musicians.

The children engage with a variety of musical performances throughout the school year, increasing their selfconfidence, creativity and sense of achievement.

Spanish

'The limits of my language mean the limits of my world.' All children in Years 3 to 6 learn Spanish language and culture, taught by our specialist Spanish teacher. We also celebrate all things 'Language and Culture' on a special day once a year, and host a Spanish themed Carnival in the summer term.

The children have the opportunity to apply their Spanish skills across a range of contexts, including writing to children in a Spanish school. Extra-curricular opportunities are available in our after-school clubs for children to further develop their language skills.



Wellbeing and Sport

We seek to promote and support the health and wellbeing of all pupils. We recognise that the individual needs of every child, their health and welfare is paramount. We know that children who feel happy and secure are more able to achieve and thrive within school and the wider community. We deeply care about each individual, and recognise the uniqueness of every child.

Children are given regular learning opportunities to explore their emotions and feelings. This is currently supported through our delivery of the RHSE curriculum, as well as through Trick Box, a whole school programme to support children's skills of emotional self-management.

We are very proud to be the first school in Bournemouth to achieve the Sandwell Wellbeing Charter Mark.

Our PE curriculum is designed to ensure children have the opportunity to take part in physical activity on a regular basis and become more physically confident and competent. We want children to develop a love and passion for sport and continue this into their later lives. All children have the opportunity to represent the school at sports events.

Living on the coast, it is important children are competent swimmers. With the use of a local pool, children take part in swimming lessons in Key Stage 2.

Underpinning future learning Our Reception Class

The Early Years Foundation Stage is the phase of learning from a child's birth to the end of their Reception Year in school.

If your child is attending a nursery or playgroup, this Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is the continuation of their learning. The main aim of this phase is to underpin all future learning.

We work with each unique child, building positive relationships and creating an enabling environment, in which they will **learn and develop.** We regularly monitor and evaluate our work. The curriculum is always under review and our aim is to constantly improve our school for our children and for our community.
