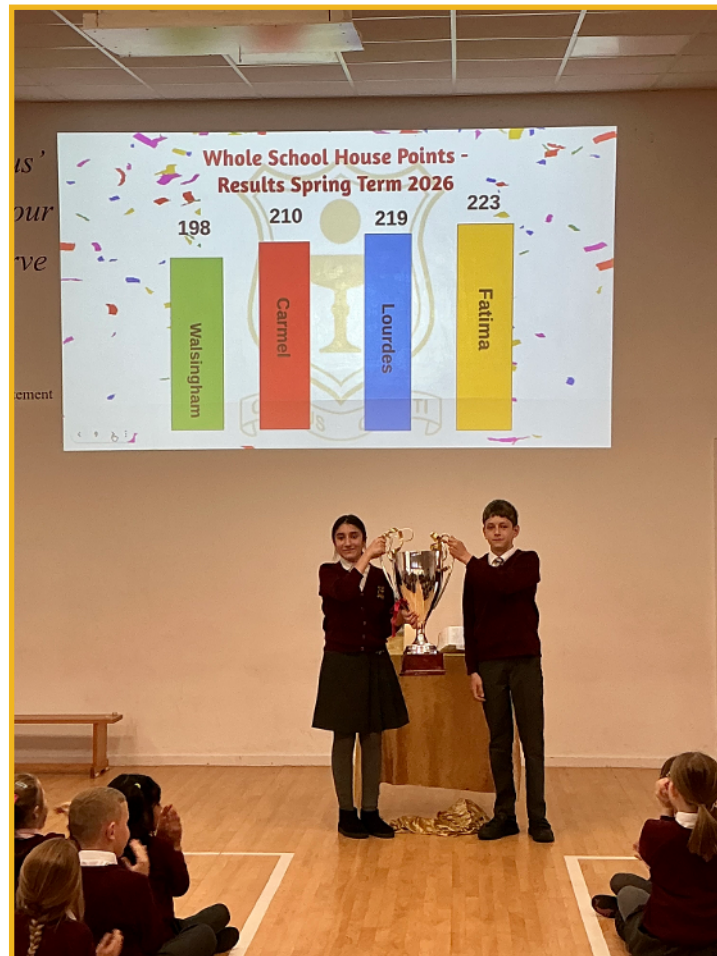


FATIMA HOUSE POINT WINNERS

ONLINE SAFETY

Children's online activity should always be supported by **open conversations and clear boundaries**. Encourage them to **be kind, think carefully before they share**, and to speak to a trusted adult if something doesn't feel right. **Remind children never to share personal information** such as their full name, address, school, or passwords, and to only communicate with people they know in real life.

It is also helpful for families to set simple rules around screen time, apps, and games, and to use parental controls where appropriate. Taking an interest in what children are doing online—by playing games together or asking about their favourite apps—can help build trust and keep communication open.

Mosaic supports children and young people across Dorset.

Mosaic was set up as a charity in 2007 to support children and young people who have been affected by the death of someone close to them, such as a parent, sibling, friend or a member of their extended family.

They are a unique service for the county, providing early-intervention support through specialist counselling to around 400 children and young people every year, and reaching around 1500 children and adults with ongoing support, advice and activities.

Mosaic's work is based around specialist bereavement counselling for children, aimed at listening to the child, understanding their grief and anxiety and helping them to ask questions about death, find ways of dealing with their emotions and importantly, to communicate with others, including their friends.

This work is evaluated using a national methodology shared with our funders and which enables the charity to embark on a constant journey of improvement.

A group of dedicated volunteers and trustees, working with the Mosaic staff, enable Mosaic to run various activity days for children across the year, strengthening peer support for those who've suffered a bereavement.

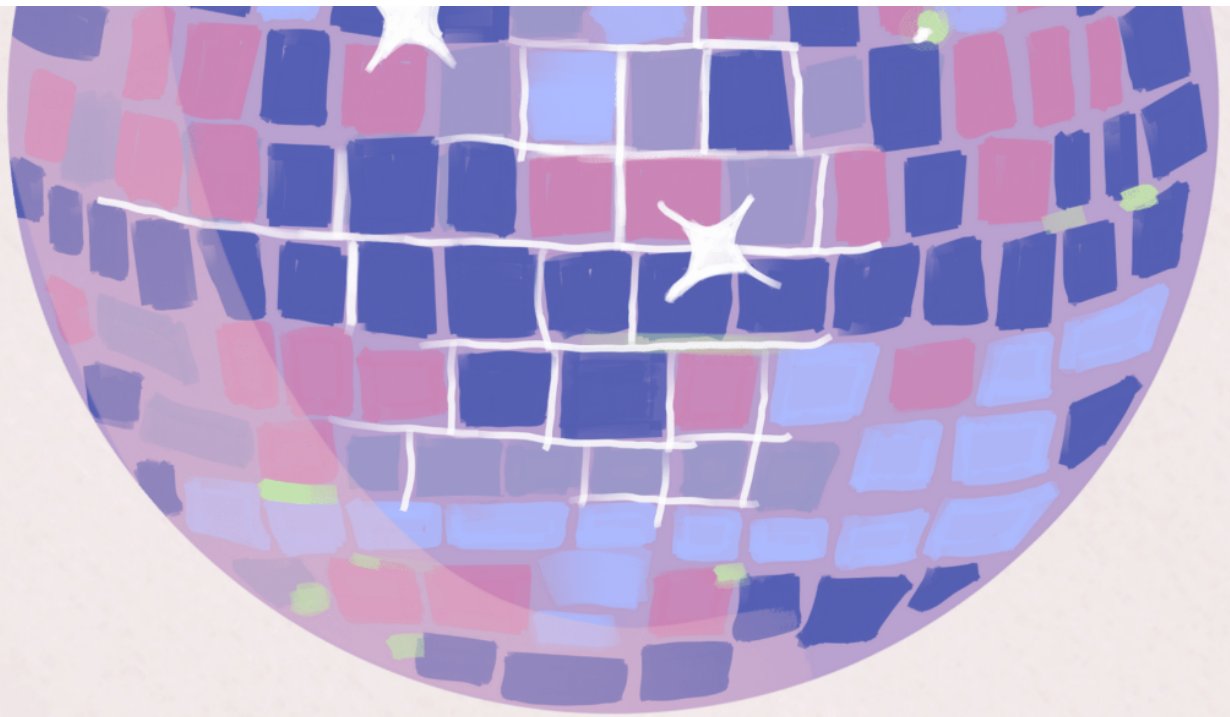

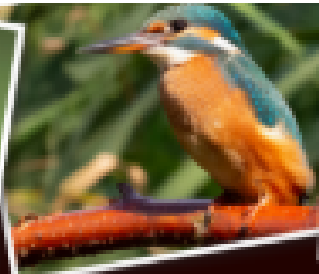
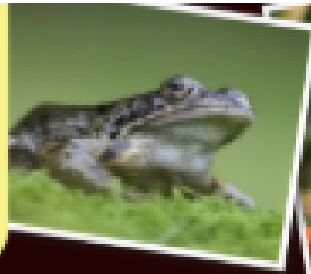
