This half term, our Curriculum Enquiry Question is: How can we take care of each other?

**Our School Gospel Virtue is Love
Catholic Social Teaching: Human Dignity (Everyone is special)**

Hook: Superhero Day!

RE	Catholic Character Education/RSHE	Literacy and Phonics
<u>Creation and Catholic Social Teaching</u> Children will be reading and learning about the story of Creation and the question ‘Who created our world and how can we say thank you?’ In our Catholic Social Teaching learning children will be thinking about how they can show love like Jesus.	CCE: Term virtue: <u>Love</u> Children will be thinking about people in their lives that look after them and how they can care for others. They will learn about how we can look after God’s world, love and take care of each other. RSHE: Ten:Ten - Module 1: Created and Loved by God. Children will be looking at how they can be a special person in their own families and how we are all different and unique. Children will also celebrate the joy of being a special person in God’s family.	Segmenting, blending, phoneme manipulation. Reading and spelling CVC words. Name writing, letter formation, tripod grip. Children will be reading a range of stories featuring superheroes: Supertato, Zog, Superworm, This is Me, A Superhero Like You, Grow Strong! A Book about Healthy Habits. Children will start to be able to retell stories and role-play stories using their own imagination.
Maths	Understanding The World	Physical Development
In Maths, children will be focussing on matching, sorting and comparing amounts. They will also be comparing size, mass and capacity as well as exploring patterns, representing 1,2,3, comparing 1,2,3 and the composition of 1,2,3. Children will be counting: saying number words in sequence, tagging each object with one number word, knowing the last number counted gives the total so far. They will all be learning to subitise: recognising small quantities without the need to count them all.	Children will think about heroes in our local community such as firefighters and police officers. They will discuss and talk about the lives of people around them and their roles in society. Children will also think about who is important in their own lives and how we can look after each other and show the virtue of Love.	Children will practise and develop both their fine motor and gross motor skills. They will use a range of tools including pencils, scissors and cutlery and start to show accuracy and care when drawing and writing. They will develop skills to demonstrate balance and coordination. In PE children will explore walking and jumping by using different body parts in different directions, motions, levels and speeds.
Personal, Social and Emotional Development	Expressive Arts & Design	Communication and Language
Children will think about self-regulation and managing themselves. They will also be building their relationships with other children and thinking about ‘Being in my World’ and how they can care for themselves and others.	Children will be learning to create with different materials and to be imaginative and expressive. They will be practising the skills of mixing colour and using their construction skills to express their creativity. They will be able to share their creations with the class and focus on a self-portrait In music children will be learning how to identify learning to find their singing voice, pitch, feeling the beat, making sounds and let’s play and joining in together.	Children will be listening to and reading a range of stories featuring superheroes. They will be retelling stories using role-play and props and practising their communication and language skills in different ways. They will begin to participate in small group and 1:1 discussions and take turns in conversations using well-formed sentences.
